The Glassens

The Glassen Grant has helped us out in ways we could not have imagined thus far. We would just like to thank the Hal and Jean Glassen Memorial Foundation for the generous grant. We would not have been able to purchase our new card reader system without it. It has been in place since September 28, 2016. It is

being used in sporting clays and is to be thought of as a debit card. Members will purchase card for \$15 and pre load it before shooting. We are selling birds at \$20 per 100 birds with a \$100 minimum or 500 birds. There is no expiration date on the card. Sporting clays can't be shot without a card.

These cards will be available during normal operating hours.



Special points of interest:

- Don't forget to stop by and get your card!
- Sporting clays are not available without one.
- Skeet, Trap and Five Stand will remain the same.
- Membership renewals are around the corner.

Indoor Archery

Indoor Archery leagues will be starting up anytime now. Beginning in January three leagues will be put into place for people to participate in. The first week in January will be held for practicing and the second week is when the leagues will start. All three leagues will have started by January 12th but the Target Bullseye league will be hosted on Tuesdays and Thursdays starting that second week. The Target

Animal league will start the same time but will be held on Mondays. All three of these leagues will have different durations. The Tuesday league will be 12 weeks long while the Thursday and Monday leagues will only be 10.

League dues are different based on your membership, if you are a key member than your fee will be \$45. If you are a standard member your

fee will be \$55 and if you are not a member at all then your league fee is \$65.

Mike Lifford the indoor archery director plans on changing keys beginning February 1st, 2017. So members make sure you renew those memberships, as you must have an active membership in order to purchase a new key. It will be 65 dollars for a new key. The key is of course for using the archery facilities.

Rifle Leagues and Repairs

Indoor Rifle leagues are coming up as well folks! Lots is going to be happening with the upcoming year not more than 3 months away. The first match for the indoor rifle league will take place in December. The first practice will be November 22nd, 2016 which is not far away at all. One thing that will remain constant is practices will land on Tuesday evenings while matches will land on Friday

evenings.

Leagues are not the only thing going on right now. More repairs have taken place recently. New Stringers and backing boards have been placed in the Pistol 25 yard range along with the 50 yard range. The roof on the 25 yard range is currently off for repair but we are working hard to get that back on for the coming winter. Although it may take

longer by ourselves. As always volunteers are more than welcome to make it out to the club and help out with anything we have going on.

Just one last reminder, as members of this great club let's be sure to follow range rules at all times. Specifically we would ask of you to not drive on the ranges unless you already have a permitted reason too. Thank you!

Outdoor Archery

The outdoor archery typically does some very cool 3-D shoots, unfortunately that has been closed up for the coming winter. There are other things to look forward to though, as Jim Powell the outdoor archery director plans on holding 1 indoor 3-

D shoot on February 11th and 12th. Both days will have start times of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. Per the usual there will be a shotgun start. There is definitely more to come on that front as well. Members will be delighted to know that there may be a second 3-

D shoot later in the year of 2017. While the date has not been found out yet you should be quite excited.

Scissor Lift recently Purchased

Some new additions are going to be made to the Sporting Clays here shortly as the club has kindly been able to purchase a Scissor Lift. The Lift has been something on the clubs mind for awhile now and we are very happy to be able to say we have recently acquired one.

Membership Renewal Reminder
